

Process for a public stand as per CVUU Bylaws

6.6 A Public stand is a resolution carrying the endorsement of the church as a whole in a matter to be presented to the general public. Public stands shall be coordinated by the Social Justice Committee.

6.6.1 Selection of issues: Upon receipt of a written petition signed by at least twenty (20) percent of the members of the congregation, the President shall call a special congregational meeting in accordance with the procedures of articles 6.3 and 6.4. Notice of the meeting shall include the text of the resolution to be considered for public stand. Statements for (and against, if applicable) the stand shall be obtained from proponents (and opponents, if applicable) and included with the notice of the meeting.

6.6.2 Hearings on the issues: The special congregation meeting shall be used as a hearing on the issue being considered for public stand. The moderator shall ensure that equal and appropriate time is afforded proponents and opponents of the public stand. No vote on the proposed stand will be taken at the hearing.

6.6.3 Voting on Public Stands: No earlier than one week following the hearing on the issue, a second meeting to vote on the resolution for public stand will be convened. The resolution must receive a $\frac{3}{4}$ affirmative vote in order to be made a public stand.

6.6.4 Modification of Procedures: The procedures in 6.6.2 and 6.6.3 may be modified for expediency by a $\frac{3}{4}$ affirmative vote of a double quorum - 40% of the members in good standing.

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
